# Liberalism Or Legalism?

Churches of Christ are often fearful of liberalism. While it is impossible to narrowly define liberalism, we can observe its basic characteristics. First, the ends justify the means; liberals believe a church should do whatever it takes to bring someone into the church building. Secondly, emotions can define faithfulness; emotionally charged worship services are the goal of liberals. Third, the social gospel is taught more than the gospel of Christ; being an example of Christ trumps teaching the doctrines of Christ. These characteristics present themselves in many different ways, from bands in worship to women preachers to adopting nearly all denominational practices.

Legalism is on the opposite end of the religious spectrum from liberalism. Legalism creates extra-biblical rules for faith. Legalists spiritual ancestors are the Jewish Pharisees. The Pharisees took the law, added their own rules, and then applied those rules to all Jews. Modern legalists operate the same way. Matters of judgment become matters of faith. Legalists pride themselves on being the sheriffs of the church, rooting out perceived liberal ideas throughout a congregation. Legalists think length of services, Bible translations, order of services, and church building architecture are all matters of fellowship. They believe that saying "no" to every non-traditional prac-

tice is a sign of faithfulness.

A church of Christ does not need to be liberal or legalistic—it needs to be biblical. Both liberals and legalists believe they are practicing biblical doctrine, but Jesus said that we should judge one another by the fruit we produce. In nearly every congregation where legalism or liberalism exists, there is a history of division, heartache, and decline. The churches that avoid the extremes are those that can proudly say without reservation that they are a church of Christ.

We are not commanded to be appeasers. We are commanded to be peacemakers. So make peace even when it is uncomfortable.
