It's not even past." Since that line was used in a money-making venture—a movie-Faulkner Literary Rights is claiming that the producers should've paid for the rights to use that quote. They are suing for "damages, disgorgement of profits, costs, and attorneys fees." Let that

be a lesson for us all: If you want to make money off of William Faulkner, you better pay up.

Don't you wish everyone was as serious about quoting correctly from the Bible as some people are about quoting correctly from William Faulkner? Unfortunately, many twist and turn God's word until His word becomes their word. Others cannot distinguish God's word from man's word. When I was at Lipscomb, another student and I were asked to represent the school in a debate about music censorship that was going to be televised on their cable channel. There were two students from each of the area colleges in the debate. The debate was fun (actually it was more of a discussion), and I looked forward to watching it on TV. But when it aired I was disappointed. Not only did I cringe at the sound of my own voice, but I thought the production quality was poor. I could see the cameras behind each of the students-cameraman and all. I started thinking, "How is it that when I am watching a movie I can't see

the cameras, but I can see them here?" In a scene in a TV show or movie, two people are talking to one another. The scene is being filmed from every angle—close up, distant, right and left—but you never see the cameras. What you can see, however, is what you're supposed to see.

And such is the case with life. God, with His infinite wisdom and sovereign power, has limited our sights. We can see what is in front of us.
