There are three levels of romantic feelings among schoolchildren: simple friendship, "liking" someone, and being in love with someone. Adults usually just speak in terms of friendship or being *in* love with someone. Aside from romantic relationships, we often say that we like certain items and love other items; we say that as a way of expressing degrees of interest. So, whether we are discussing people or things, love is always higher or better than like.

The Bible presents like and love in a different way. John 3:16 states plainly that God loved the world so much that He sent His Son to die for us. But it wasn't necessary for God to like the world's people be-

fore He could love them. The world was full of sinful, unlikeable people, yet God still loved them. We should extend that same love toward everyone. To love someone doesn't require that we endorse every deed of every person. It simply means that we will treat every person the way we would want to be treated—to have their best interest at heart.

In human relations, too many people think that like should come before love. That's why there is so much hostility in the world. "If I don't like you," some say, "then I have no obligation to treat you well. I can avoid you, gossip about you, wish the worst for you, and encourage others to feel the same way

about you that I do." But that is not the Christian doctrine on love. To love God but hate man is illogical for the people of faith.
