(3) Keep secrets. Not all information is for public consumption. If your first instinct is to grab your phone once you've heard an interesting story about someone else, you're not trustworthy. The best relief for a hurting person is often just a confidential ear.

Tell Me A Story

Don Hewitt, who created 60 Minutes and produced it until 2004, gave his correspondents a four-word charge: Tell me a story. The show was divided into four segments, and if each segment didn't tell a good story, Hewitt wouldn't run it. He knew that the audience wanted to learn something, feel something, and—most of the time—do something. For 21 straight years, 60 Minutes was a top ten rated show.

Hewitt's objectives were not new: They were as ancient as the Bible. After all, Jesus was a storyteller. We usually don't call Him a storyteller, but that's what He was. He told parables, sure. But that's just a type of a story. A parable is a short story that runs along the side of a truth to help magnify the truth. Jesus told stories about a man who had two sons, a man who was beaten and left for dead, a man who lost a sheep, and a man who sowed seed. These stories were often void of names, dates, and specific places, because those things didn't matter. What mattered was that the hearers understood things like forgiveness, evangelism, compassion, and eternity.

The Bible itself is just one story told in many different ways. It's all about God redeeming man. The Bible shows us men and women who ran toward God and were blessed and those who rejected God and were punished. It's a fascinating story.

You have a story to tell. It is different from my story, but it's a story that needs to be told. It's a story about how you came to know Jesus, about how you were moved to act on the knowledge you received, and how you are striving to live for Him each day. It's not selfish to tell your faith story. It's inspiring to those who are lost in sin. Your story might be the only sermon some people ever hear. So you need to tell them before it's too late.
