Finally, many claim that women in the New Testament served the Lord in many ways, so they should do the same today. To that I say yes and no. Yes, the Bible is filled with godly women who fulfilled their Godgiven responsibilities in the church. Every church is blessed by faithful women: they usually comprise a majority of a congregation's membership. But that doesn't change God's stated will for certain roles within the church. Unbiblical Feminism, Pt. 1

You are probably unaware of a website called gal328.org, and I hesitate to bring it to your attention. It is administered by members of the churches of Christ who seek to include women in every aspect of church work, from preaching to the eldership to public prayers. In the "History of gal328" section of the site, Chris Hutson writes, "Pretty much everyone who grew up in the Church of Christ knew the case against women in ministry. But where could anyone find the case for women in ministry? We did not want to dilute our message by giving yet another forum to the voices against women. Having framed the issue as

a matter of "gender justice," we did not want to use our space to help make a case against justice."

There are many false assumptions that are made by those who run this site; therefore, their conclusions are bogus. First, Galatians 3:28, the central theme of their movement, states: "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus." The context of this verse makes its meaning clear: Everyone who obeys the gospel, regardless of social standing or gender differences, is saved by the blood of Christ-we are all one in Him. This verse,

however, does not define the particular *responsibilities* we have in the church. We all have the same value in Christ, but we do not serve in the same roles. Paul describes preachers, elders, and deacons as men (I Tim. 2:11-15; 3:1-13), and he even explained why it was to be so.

Second, leaders of the gender neutrality movement couch the issue in judicial terms—"gender *justice*." It is much easier to rally a group of sympathizers to a cause if you say you are advocating on behalf of people who have been mistreated. You can't have justice unless you have a victim.
