Facebook, Twitter, and other social media websites have maximized the "If it bleeds, it leads" philosophy, with many users trying to one-up each other with salacious, attention-grabbing posts.

No matter what you may see on television, and no matter how bad things become in the world around us, remember that God is still on the throne. And nothing is stronger than Him.

If You Give It To Them, They'll Use It

In 1936, the Social Security Administration began issuing cards to thousands of Americans through local post offices. An industrious walletmaker, in an effort to show the versatility of his wallets, began putting sample cards in each one. But there was one unforeseen problem: The sample card had a real Social Security number on it. The number was 078-05-1120, and it was owned by the man's secretary, Hilda Schrader Whitcher. (The number has since been voided.) In just seven years, 5,755 people had fraudulently used the number. It was even being used as recently as 1977.

This Social Security number blunder reminds us that if we give something

to someone, they'll use it. That point is obvious, but we often fail to appreciate it in everyday life. Here are some examples:

- (1) *Time.* Do you ever feel like your personal time is never really *your* time? Do you feel like you spend your days and nights attending to the needs (or wants) of others? If you are willing to give away your time, someone will gladly use it for their interests. Serve God sacrificially, but leave time for family and personal spiritual development.
- (2) *Emotions.* Ever had your feelings hurt? Of course you have. Sometimes that heartache occurs when you give your heart to those who

don't know how to handle it. Protect your heart.

- (3) Money. Life isn't free. It takes money to do anything. The Bible teaches us to be generous, but the Bible doesn't teach us to be an ATM for those who are irresponsible. Be judicious in your generosity. Think when you give.
- (4) Opinions. You don't have to say everything you think. Your friends and family won't use everything you say against you in a court of law, but they'll use it against you everywhere else. Be careful when and where you express yourself.
