Israel Observations

Over the past week, I've been trying to digest everything I learned in Israel—it was a whirlwind of information. Here I want to highlight some general observations about the Muslim and Jewish cultures we encountered.

(1). Land matters to the Jew and Palestinian Muslim. We saw walls, checkpoints, settlements, and flags. Both the Palestinians and Jews claim rights to the West Bank (or, as the Jews call it, Samaria and Judea). The land matters. There are holy cities and holy places that each side claims it should possess. Their faiths are tied to pieces of geography. But Christians make no such claims. We have no holy places. We have no shrines or monuments. Our church buildings are not sacred. Our faith is not tied to brick and mortar.

(2). Judaism and Islam are works-based religions. The Jews have their dietary laws (which seem to vary depending on which rabbi you're speaking with), their holy days, and their festivals. The Muslims have Ramadan, their daily required prayers, dress codes, and so on. All of these things must be observed in the manner in which their leaders say so, or else they'd be out of favor with God or Allah. In Christ, we are no longer slaves to the old law (Gal. 5:1). We are not subject to dietary restrictions or compulsory prayers. We simply live by faith.

(3). Both religions reject Jesus. This, of course, is the obvious distinction between Jews, Muslims, and Christians. To the Jews, Jesus was just a Jewish prophet, but not the Messiah. To the Muslim, Muhammad brought Allah's revelation to man. Both the Jew and Muslim need to accept, obey, and follow Jesus in order to be saved, but so far, they are unwilling.

"This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth" (I Tim. 2:3-4).
