Do You Know Your Bible?

At age 13 the typical Jewish boy will observe his Bar Mitzvah. He reads the Torah publicly for the first time and then his synagogue declares him responsible for all of his religious activity. Neither he nor his rabbi takes this event lightly. It is preceded by months of training and careful study of Jewish tradition and the ancient Hebrew language. No Jewish 13-year-old boy is unaware of the Toranic teachings.

I wonder if the same could be said of Christian 13 year -olds? What if a similar event took place at the baptism of all Christian young people? Would that young person know his Bible? Would he even have an elementary knowledge of the background and purpose of the 66 books of the Bible? Are we as dedicated to the serious study of our Scriptures as a Jew is of the Torah or as a Muslim is of the Koran?

A Bible professor at one of our Christian universities surveyed incoming freshmen over a period of several years. He asked them a variety of questions about their spiritual lives. Year in and year out the results were the same: A majority of the freshmen attended worship services at least twice a week, a majority attended a small group Bible study, a majority had attended a Christian retreat/camp/seminar within the previous year, and (gulp) a majority did not know that Abraham lived before Moses! How is it that these teenagers were so interested in many activities in the church, yet they did not have even a basic knowledge of the Bible?

The answers could be many—little opportunity for formal teaching, "the Bible is boring and confusing," churches have replaced book-chapter-verse sermons with "feel good" sermons—who knows. However, one thing we know for sure: When we close our Bibles, we muzzle God.

Shame on us.

Eruption

You've heard of Harry Truman, the man who became president when Franklin Roosevelt died. But you probably do not know the other Harry Truman, who, at the age of 83, stubbornly refused to leave his home near Mount St. Helens in Washington state. He died along with 56 others on May 18, 1980 when Mount St. Helens erupted, covering him and his town with 150 feet of volcanic debris.

For several months leading up to the eruption, Truman's friends urged him to leave his home of 54 years. Mount St. Helens had been spewing debris and ash for quite some time, and local geologists were convinced that a sizeable eruption was immi-

nent. "If the mountain goes, I'll go with it," Truman insisted. "You can move the mountain, but I'm never coming down." Harry Truman was right—he never came down.

Foolish, is it not? Mr. Truman ignore repeated warnings. If he had only followed the instructions of the experts, his last days would've been filled with peace, not terror. He joins a long list of people who ignored warnings only to lose their lives foolishly. The book of Genesis recounts the story of Noah, a man who followed God's instruction without hesitation and was saved from a worldwide flood. Those who did not heed Noah's instruction were drowned. Genesis 19 tells us

the story of Lot's family, who heeded the angel's warning and fled the wicked city of Sodom. Later in Scripture, the Israelites were captured by the Babylonians for refusing to listen to God's prophets.

In the New Testament, we read many warnings about the return of Christ. I Thess. 5:2-3: "For you yourselves know full well that the day of the Lord will come just like a thief in the night. While they are saying, 'Peace and safety!' then destruction will come upon them suddenly..."

Heed God's warnings. Get ready to see the Lord.
