John Wilkes Booth thought he would be hailed as a hero of the South. He figured his name would be remembered with the likes of Stonewall Jackson and Robert E. Lee. But he was mistaken. After shooting Abraham Lincoln in the back of the head, Booth fled into Maryland, accompanied by David Herold. For 12 days Booth avoided the pursuing Union army...and eagerly read Southern newspapers, hoping to read effusive praise for his act. But no praise came. Southerners, knowing that General Lee had surrendered to General Grant five days before Lincoln's murder, at Appomattox Courthouse, Virginia, considered Booth a coward. Shooting an unarmed man in the back of the head was not bravery. It was cowardice.

Once troops surrounded the barn where Booth and Herold were hiding, Herold surrendered, but Booth was shot in the neck through a gap in the barn wall. He was dragged out of the barn, and, with his last breaths, looked down at his hands and said, "Useless! Useless!"

Regret can be crippling. Imagine looking at your hands at the end of your life and thinking that your days were useless. Solomon declared, "I know that there is nothing better for them than to rejoice and to do good in one's lifetime; moreover, that every man who eats and drinks sees good in all his labor—it is a

After the Israelites escaped Egyptian slavery, they were essentially a rag-tag, undisciplined crowd of people. They complained. They argued. They didn't know where they were going.
