Ecclesiastes 3:1 states: "There is an appointed time for everything." It is easy to misread that verse and think it states: "Everything that happens in life is good simply because it happens." Notice verses two through 8. Solomon says there is a time for death, tearing down, throwing stones, and war. Are any of those things good? No. Those things happen in life. Solomon does not give any moral value to anything he lists in those verses.

In Solomon's circular account of life in Ecclesiastes, he writes: "That which has been is that which will be, and that which has been done is that which will be done. So there is nothing new under the sun" (Eccl. 1:9). In other words, what goes around comes around.

Since many negative things will happen in your life due to no fault of your own, how will you handle those situations? Here are a few ideas:

- 1. Don't be surprised. Solomon warned you.
- 2. Don't spend countless hours trying to find the cause.
- 3. It's okay to cry about it. Sad people cry. Don't move to quickly into "fix it" mode.
- 4. Pray, and then pray some more. Find wisdom in God's word.
