Honoring the Person Who Gave Birth to Our Faith (II Timothy)

Very shortly after Olivia and I began dating, I took her to see a movie called *My Life*. It was the story of Bob and Gail Jones, a couple who were expecting their first child. Bob is diagnosed with kidney cancer early on in the pregnancy, and it is likely that he will lose his life before their baby is born.

Heartbroken at the prospect of never getting to know his child, Bob decides to record videos to teach his unborn baby about himself and how to deal with various things in life. As you might imagine this was a very, very sad movie, and not exactly a great date movie! It was also a movie that I never really care to sit through again.

However, several years ago I was asked to preach a sermon about the 5th commandment to "Honor your father and mother." As I was preparing for that sermon, I began to think about the premise of this movie and the idea of encapsulating the ways in which my daughters could honor me as their father. If I were to record videos or write letters, what would they contain?

As I was pondering this idea, it occurred to me that Paul's final instructions to his "true child in the faith" (1 Timothy 1:2) Timothy in the epistle of II Timothy would be the exact things I would want to leave for my daughters. More than anything I want Kate and Sara to be followers of Christ, and these teachings of Paul get to the core of what it means to live a life dedicated to Him.

While I know that not everyone has/had a father who helped lead them to Christ, all of us who have a faith in Him were led by someone. On this Father's Day, let's consider how we can honor the one who helped give birth to our faith by looking at these instructions from Paul in II Timothy:
