## The Mission of the Church Lesson 3 - To Protect and to Serve

This morning we continue our series called "The Mission of the Church", by looking at the local leadership of God's church. During last week's lesson, we discussed that there are no longer Apostles today as their mission has been completed and no one alive has seen the risen Jesus. If there are no longer Apostles of Jesus Christ today, then who are the local leaders of the church?

When Paul met with the Ephesian elders at the end of his third missionary journey, he gave them final instructions that can be viewed as a mandate or "mission statement" for the primary responsibility of the eldership (Acts 20:28-30). In businesses today, it is common to have a "mission statement." The Oxford Languages Dictionary defines a "mission statement" as a formal summary of the aims and values of a company, organization, or individual. Paul's "mission statement" for the elders is this, "Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock...to care for the church of God..." He adds to this, "after my departure fierce wolves will come...from among your own selves will arise men speaking twisted things..." Paul is calling on the elders at Ephesus to be protectors of the truth of Jesus Christ. If Christ governs with His truth, and His church is built upon His truth (Eph 2:19-22), then the church must be about upholding this truth (1 Tim 3:14-15). This is the primary responsibility of the eldership. Today, many elderships function more like a business board of directors, dealing with every decision and matter that is facing a congregation. My fear is that in doing this, they often lose sight of their true mandate to be protectors of the truth. To be protectors, they must know

the truth (**Titus 1:9**), ensure the truth is taught, and that the ekklēsia (the called out / the church) is instructed in the truth. Peter adds to this that elders should fulfill their responsibility "...not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly;" (**1 Peter 5:2**)

When it comes to the eldership, the ekklēsia also has a responsibility. Paul clearly tells Timothy that elders should be treated with "honor," especially those who teach (1 Tim 5:17). The Hebrew writer tells the church to "obey" and "submit" to their leaders. He also says that as they serve, "let them do this with joy and not with groaning."

The \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ - Another role that is clearly defined within a local congregation in the New Testament is that of a deacon. While this is never referred to as an "office," it is clearly an expectation that deacons will be a part of a local congregation (Phil 1:1). The word translated "deacon" simply means "servant," and this was the mandate given to the seven men who were selected in Acts 6:1-6 to "serve tables" so that the apostles of Jesus Christ could continue focusing on the preaching of the "word of God." In today's church, these would be men who would focus on the day-to-day activity of the ekklēsia so that the eldership can continue to focus on their primary mission as protectors of the truth. In 1 Tim 3:8-13, Paul lays out qualifications for deacons that are like those of elders given earlier, but without emphasis on the ability to teach.

The \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ - The final role is that of an evangelist or teacher (Eph 4:11). These individuals work with the elders (or could even be an elder - 1 Tim 5:17) to "build up the body of Christ." Their mandate can be found in Paul's instructions to Timothy and Titus. To Timothy he says to "preach the word", "reprove", "rebuke", and "exhort". He goes on to explain that teaching the truth is critical, because "the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching..." (2 Tim 4:1-5). To Titus he simply says "teach what accords with sound doctrine" (Titus 2:1). Evangelists are teachers of the truth. In this role, Paul also argues they should receive their financial support for this work from the church (1 Cor 9:14).
