Four Women are listed in the first two sections.  
1.) Women were not generally listed in genealogies.  
2.) Probability that all four were Gentile (Gal 3:28-29)

Possible Explanations for the Deviation from Luke's account (Luke 3:23-38):

1. Matthew records Joseph's lineage - Luke records Mary's
2. Matthew records the legal lineage (throne) - Luke records the blood lineage
3. Different names for the same individuals
