The Syrians defend the field while the Ammonites defend the city gates. Israel divides their army between Joab and Abishai. Joab engaged the Syrians while Abishai engaged the Ammonites. Joab tells Abishai to "Be of good courage, and let us be strong for our people and for the cities of our God. And may the LORD do what is good in His sight." Both armies fled before Israel. David engages Hadadezer and Shobach (Commander of his army) at Helam. In this battle David defeated 700 charioteers and 40,000 horsemen. He killed Shobach and all the kings of Syria made peace with David. From this point forward, Syria was afraid to bring aid to Ammon.
