**What We Missed (II Samuel 23:8-38)** - This section contains a list and exploits of David’s “mighty men”. They are divided into two groups: the three and the thirty (note: the thirty contains more than 30 men; see **23:39**). This list is essentially the same as **1 Chron 11:10–47**, but the Chronicler alters the accounts slightly and expands the register of names. In addition, he places this catalog at the beginning of David’s reign, indicating that these warriors and their feats helped David to consolidate his kingdom (see **1 Chron 11:10**).

**What We Missed (II Samuel 24:1-25)** - The book of Samuel concludes with an account of David commissioning a census and incurring the judgment of God. David’s repentance, God’s forgiveness, and the purchase of Araunah’s threshing floor provide an element of hope. David’s acquisition of the threshing floor anticipates the events that follow in **1 Kgs 5–6**. Solomon, will build God’s temple on the same site his father procured (see **1 Chron 21**).

**“The Last Words of David” (II Samuel 23:1-7)**

**Anointed by God** (v. 1 - Third Person) - Three phrases David uses to describe himself...

**Inspired by God** (vv. 2-3a - First Person) - Four phrases David uses to describe God speaking through him...

**Message from God** (vv. 3b-4) - In God’s words, he provides four characteristics of the one who “rules over men”:

**Covenant from God** (v. 5) - The beginning of verse 5 is difficult to interpret because of the Hebrew wording. The challenge comes from the placement of the word translated “not”. The NKJV and KJV present David as saying that his house is “not” consistent with the characteristics described in God’s message. This could be a lament at the end of his life in view of his failures. However, the NASB, NIV, and ESV have David asking rhetorically, is his house “not” standing right with God? Regardless of the interpretation of these words, the remainder of verse 5 is clear. God made an “everlasting covenant” with David (**7:11-16; Ps 89:3-4; Isa 9:6-7; 11:1-10; Jer 23:5-6**), and God will see it through. There are five words that David uses which describe God’s fulfillment of this promise:

**Rebelling against God** (vv. 6-7) - While David’s house will be sustained forever, those who rebel against God’s promised one will be like thorns cast out of the harvest and “utterly burned with fire” (**Mt 3:11-12; Lk 3:15-17**).
