¹⁸Servants, **be subject** to your <u>masters</u> with all respect, not only to the good and gentle but also to the unjust.

¹⁹For this is a gracious thing, when, mindful of God, one endures sorrows while suffering unjustly.

²⁰For what credit is it if, when you sin and are beaten for it, you endure? But if when you **do good** and suffer for it you **endure**, this is a gracious thing in the sight of God.

²¹For to this you have been called, because **Christ also suffered** for you, **leaving you an example**, so that you might follow in his steps.

²²He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth.

²³When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly.

²⁴He himself *bore our sins* in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. <- Rom 6:1-23
