

\_\_ **(16-18)** - John lets us know this healing was performed on the Sabbath (v. 9b). The Jews confronted the formerly crippled man for violation of the fourth commandment concerning the Sabbath (Ex 20:8-11). Upon this accusation, he points out that Jesus is the one who violated the law, and later helps the Jews identify Jesus in the temple. John tells us that the Jews persecuted Jesus because of this perceived breaking of the law (v. 16). However, this escalates quickly from persecution for being a lawbreaker to a desire to kill Jesus because He claimed God to be His "Father" (v. 17), which they took as a claim to be "equal with God" (v. 18). They would have seen this as blasphemy. \_ (19-29) - Instead of backing off from His claim of being the Son of God (i.e. "equal with God" v. 18) when faced with Jews who desired to kill Him, He doubles down by speaking of the authority He has been given by the Father and expressing in at least three different ways that He and the Father are one. The first of these claims comes in verse 19 when He says, "whatever the Father does, the Son does likewise." This is drawing a direct connection between the activities of the Father and those of the Son (like v. 17). The second comes in verses 21 and 26 where Jesus explains that both He and the Father are givers of life (1:4-5). The mission of Jesus on this earth was to fulfill the plan of God so those who follow Him might have life (10:10; 14:6). The final way Jesus expresses equality with the Father comes in verse 23 where Jesus not only claims that both He and the Father are worthy of honor, but that one cannot honor the Father without honoring the Son! \_ **(19-29)** – Jesus also lists three activities the Father has given Him to complete: [1] He will show the Son "greater works" (v. 20). These are performed through the Son on earth, because their purpose is "so that you may marvel". These works were used by God to attest to the claims of Jesus (Acts 2:22). [2] The Son has the responsibility to judge the world (vv. 22, 27; Mt 25:31-32; Acts 10:42). [3] He was sent to be the giver of life (vv. 21, 24-25, 28-29). He says that He will give life "to whom He will" (v. 21). Those whom "He will" are those who "hear...my word and believe..." (vv. 24; 3:16). Those who

T\_\_\_\_\_\_(30-47) – Jesus states regarding His claims, "If I alone bear witness about myself, my testimony is not true" (v. 31). He then reviews three who have testified concerning His claims. These include [1] John the Baptist (vv. 32-35; 1:19), [2] God the Father (vv. 36-44), and [3] Moses (45-47; Deut 18:15-22; Heb 2:2).

receive "eternal life" from the Son will "not come into judgment" (v. 24).
