
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Memorize the Gospel of John (Chapter 11) Sermon - John 11:1-57

______ - Let's consider two groups of people who are afraid in Chapter 11:

The Disciples (8; 10:40): They know the Jews are waiting to kill Jesus (5:18; 7:10-11, 19, 25: 8:58-59; 10:31-31) and are concerned their life will also be in danger if they go to Judea (16).

Mary and Martha (1-2): Friends of Jesus (5; Lk 10:38-42; Mt 26:6-12; Mk 11:11; 14:3-9) who are deeply concerned about their brother Lazarus (1-3). They must have known this illness was severe since they are asking Jesus to immediately come back to Bethany (approximately two miles from Jerusalem – 18) just after the Jews were ready to stone Him (10:31).

F______ - The actions of Jesus in response to these concerns must have confused and even frustrated those who were afraid:

Mary and Martha: After hearing the news about Lazarus, Jesus "stayed two days longer" and Lazarus died (**6**, **14**). When He finally goes to Bethany, both Mary and Martha express their frustration in saying, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died" (**21**, **32**). Those who had come to Bethany to grieve said, "Could not he…have kept this man from dying?" (**37**).

The Disciples: When He makes the decision to go to Bethany after the two-day delay, the disciples verbalize their dismay by saying, "the Jews were just now seeking to stone you, and are you going there again?" (8). Thomas is supportive but says "we may die with him" (16).

Jesus wants them to have Faith in His purpose even though they do not understand His actions (Isa 55:8-98; Prov 19:21; Rom 8:28; Heb 11:1). He says that Lazarus will live (4, 23), that He and His disciples must work while it is day (9; 9:4), that these events and His actions are to bring glory to God and His Son (4, 40), and that all of this is so they may believe (15, 25-26, 40, 42).

By allowing the events to unfold as they did, He shows them two aspects of His nature:

- 1. His H_____ (32-36, 38; 1:14; Phil 2:5-11; Heb 2:17-18; 4:15)
- 2. His P_____ over death (41-44; 5:20; Acts 2:22-24).

F______- - Jesus wanted the people who witnessed these things to "believe" in Him (15), but they had a choice. "Many", when confronted with the Son of God, "believed in Him" (45). Others, "went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done" (46), which imminently led to Jesus' death.
